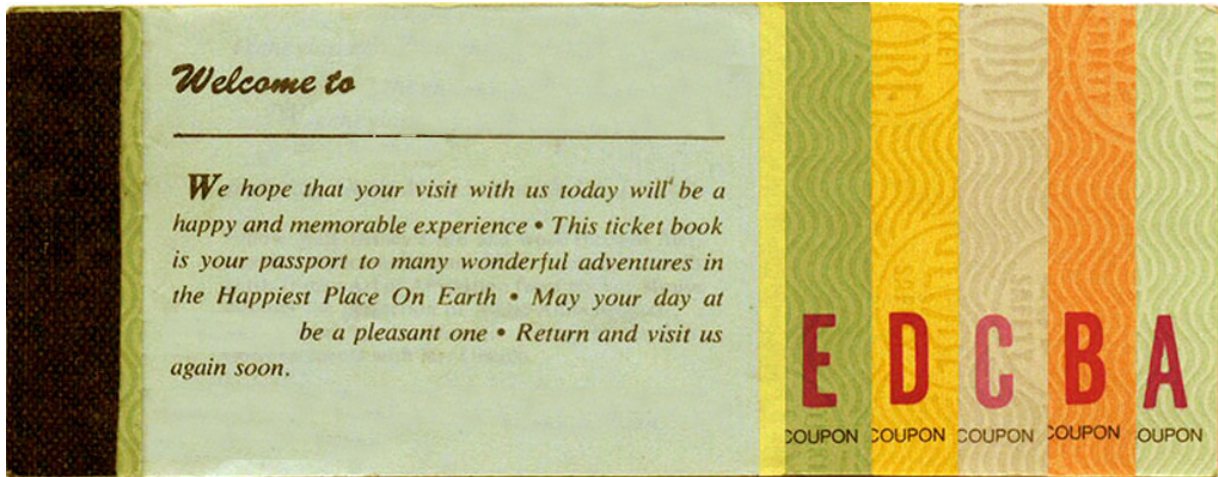


1. What is this the Ticket to?



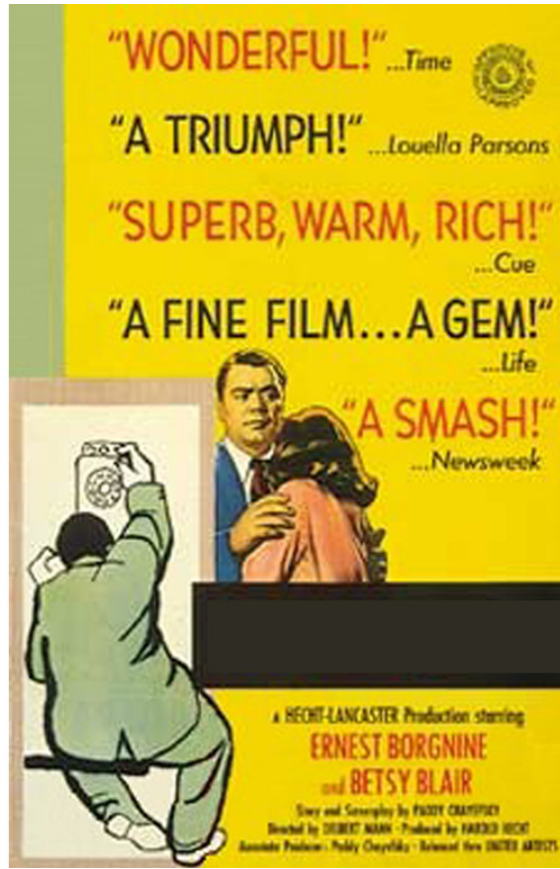
